Dear People of St. Peter's,

When I pulled on my striped baseball socks and laced up my best pair of cleats I felt invincible. Little league baseball absorbed my best efforts to hit farther, run faster, and throw harder than any other boy on the Piggly Wiggly team. The sensation of sprinting through the orange clay of the baselines was exhilarating...until the ball came whizzing right past me in time for the 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, or 3<sup>rd</sup> baseman to tag me out.

This is how it is with Jesus' parables. We're running along, doing just fine, until these allegories slip up beside us and call us up short.

It makes sense when you examine what the word 'parable' actually means. It is an ancient Greek compound word. You already know that 'para' means beside, as in parallel lines. It is a little harder to see that 'ble' is the condensed English spelling of the Greek verb 'balleo' which means 'to throw.' This is quite literally where we get the noun—'ball'—which is something you throw, and also the adjective—'ballistic'—which is a missile or a rocket that gets 'thrown' into space.

And so the parables of Jesus are thrown beside us with analogies and characters and truths to challenge and inspire a deeper understanding of reality from God's perspective. Parables can delight us, but most often they call us up short. Jesus tells short stories, plainly revealing that we are not as fast or as strong or as smart as we like to think we are.

A couple of years ago I was speaking to the Rev. Jack Hardaway, an exceptional priest in our diocese and a former curate at St. Peter's. Shaking my head at the rapid and regular truths, characters, challenges, and inspirations of being a pastor, I said this: "Every day is a parable!" Ever since that day, Jack has reminded me of what I said.

On Saturday, March 4<sup>th</sup> Jack will come home to St. Peter's and lead a Quiet Day for us. Mark your calendar now and save that date. You really only need to save about half of that date, because Jack will be offering several brief reflections about everyday parables, and the surprise of God in our lives. We will have time between his reflections to be quiet and prayerful, thinking about our own everyday parables. We will enjoy a calm and quiet lunch together, and conclude with a celebration of the Holy Eucharist.

Sometimes we can become seduced into thinking we are invincible. We are running along, doing just fine, until someone or something is thrown alongside us. We are reminded of what God said through the prophet, Isaiah, "My thoughts are not your thoughts, nor your ways my ways," says the Lord. "My word goes forth from my mouth; it will not return to me empty."

As we begin the season of Lent on March 1<sup>st</sup>, allow yourself to slow down and listen for the Word of God, speaking in everyday parables. Open your mind and heart to the challenging and inspiring words of Jesus as well as the challenging and inspiring stories of your own life experience. They are not just calling us up short, when we feel a little invincible. They are also calling us home—to a life with God and one another—that is eternally blessed.

Now you see that even little league baseball can become a parable!

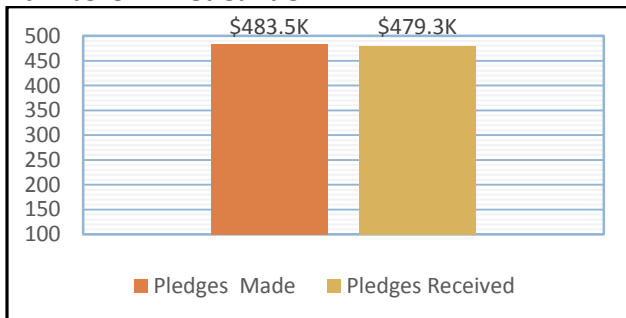

## Volunteers Needed- United Ministries Food Deliveries



St. Peter's Outreach Advocates are looking for a few more volunteers to assist with the monthly deliveries of non-perishable food items to United Ministries. Here is a brief overview of the process. We currently need volunteers for the months of Mar, May, June, Sep, Nov and Dec.

1. Parishioners place food contributions in the wagon in the narthex or in the bins labeled "United Ministries Food" in the back hallway across from Stockstill Hall.
2. After the **10:30** service on Sunday, retrieve the wagon from the front of the pews on the right hand side of the church. Load the contents of the wagon and any food in the bins by Stockstill Hall in the back into your vehicle. Leave the empty wagon in the narthex.
3. Food can be delivered to United Ministries at your convenience during the week. The address is: **606 Pendleton Street, Greenville. 864-232-6463**. The food pantry is manned **Monday- Friday** from **8 AM - noon**. Drive around to the loading dock in the back and knock on the door. If you need to make the delivery after noon, go into the main office and let the receptionist know you have a delivery. She will send someone to open the pantry door and help unload. On Friday, the office closes **at noon**, so do not attempt to deliver after noon on that day.

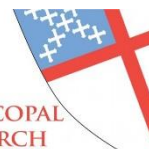
## New Centering Prayer Group
