

## St Peters Minutes of the Vestry

April 12, 2021

**Attendance:** Fr. Furman, April, Kyle C. Bobbie, Lindsey, Dot, Beck, Rhys, Nathan, Malissa, Jennifer, Bill, Shelley. My apologies if I have left anyone out, for some reason my list from that night is incomplete, and I was trying to work from memory.

Absent: Dexter, Sarah

Meeting was called to order at 6:00 pm.

**Acceptance of the minutes:** Malissa made a motion, with a second from Jennifer, to accept the minutes from the previous meeting. After a vote, the motion passed.

**Gospel Reflection:** Fr. Furman read the passage from Luke. There was discussion among the group following the reading.

### **Discussion:**

Columbarium Project- There was a problem with the order for the pavers- the wrong color pavers were sent. This will result in a significant delay of at least 3-4 months minimum. This product is being used for the fascia of the Columbarium.

In-person Worship Updates- The numbers of persons being allowed to participate in worship is rising, per the Bishop's latest directive. It can be 15% of our total, which is approximately 45 people, or 18 households. This will continue to be a changing number as more individuals become vaccinated.

Parish Administrator Update- Danielle finished on Maundy Thursday. Sue started two weeks prior to that.

Sister Parish Updates- Furman wants to interact with the other parishes to share information.

### **Decisions:**

Columbarium Pricing Change- There is a price adjustment by the Committee, raising the cost from \$2000, to \$2500 per niche. This price does not include the name plates. The prices are effective until the Dedication Ceremony. Rhys made a motion, with a 2nd from Kyle, to adopt the Committee's recommendations. After a vote, the motion passed.

Pressure Washing- Kyle presented updates to the group. The cost will be within the \$3500-5000 range approximately. The goal will be to gather three estimates with the assistance of the Facilities Committee.

Organ Replacement- There have been a number of unsolicited donations toward the organ replacement by some parishioners.

Sabbatical Installment #2- Father Furman will be taking the next portion of his Sabbatical, in a 5 week time period, June 25- August 2.

There was a motion made by Beck, and a 2nd from Kyle, to approve this second phase of Sabbatical. After a vote, the motion passed.

**New Business:**

There will be a need for people with technology knowledge and ability, to help on Sunday mornings with A/V - camera, soundboard, etc.

**Treasurer's Report:**

Bill presented the financials to the group. Discussion followed among the group.

Income- Total revenues for the month of \$60, 146, are \$9,416 over budget

Expenses- Total expenses for the month of \$46,490 are \$1,280 under budget of \$47,770.

With a motion from April and a 2nd from Dot, to adopt the Treasurer's report into the minutes, after a vote the motion passes and the report was adopted into the minutes.

**Rector's Report-** Fr. Furman spoke about Holy Week. He also mentioned that the Bishop's Visitation will be September 19th.

There being no further business, the meeting ended at 7:30 pm, and was closed with prayer led by Fr. Furman.
